## On the List Serve

In January, the hot topics on the coordinator list serve were **resident meals**, **conference attendance allowance**, and **other benefits (moving bonus)**. Here's what you said:

**Resident Meals:** Programs run the gamut of options for paying for resident meals; the common thread is that most programs provide meals for their residents whether by ordering food for most or all of resident conferences or by providing a meal stipend loaded directly onto residents' ID badges. Meal cards for call shifts are also popular.

**Conferences:** Most programs provide a cap, per resident, for attending conferences or other CME activities or for books, journals, or other expenses. Most programs cover resident expenses if they are presenting at a conference or had material accepted. Some allow these funds to be used for rotation, board exam, or technology expenses.

**Other benefits:** Moving expenses generally are not covered by programs, especially those with higher caps on resident food and educational expenses.

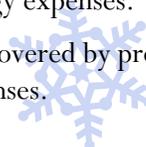

## New Innovations

New Innovations is used by almost half of the coordinators who responded to a survey sent recently. NI's annual spring conference is April 17-19 in Cleveland, Ohio. ## MedHub

MedHub regularly schedules teleconferences with its users' GME offices to discuss new features and work through problems. If MedHub is your management suite of choice, contact your GME office to check on any upcoming teleconferences.

## ERAS

ERAS was the most widely used program based on the above-mentioned survey. However, new coordinators may find the Program Director's Work Station a trial by fire approach to recruitment season. ERAS' website has several online training sessions and tutorials available on their [website](#), along with resources for new staff (timelines, a user guide, program updates and e-news) available [here](#).

## GME Track

GME Track is "a resident database and tracking system that was introduced in March 2000 to assist GME administrators and program directors in the collection and management of GME data." Additional information and program updates are available on the [AAMC website](#).

## E\*Value

Almost one-third of you reported using E\*Value as your management system of choice. Additional information about E\*Value's upcoming information releases has been sought. These updates will work hand-in-hand with the site's new user interface.

## MyEvaluations

While less popular than other management systems, MyEvaluations promises its clients free training sessions and 24-hour support. One benefit of a smaller system is quick turn around from tech support: 3 hours for critical issues and 24 hours for non-critical issues.

## PediaLink

Initially, PediaLink's site is a little overwhelming, as it contains resources for pediatricians, residents, and programs. Don't panic! The site has an immensely helpful [e-reference guide for coordinators](#).
