## Milestone Reporting Delayed

On May 3, the APPD drafted a letter to the ACGME outlining the pediatric community's support of delaying milestone reporting until June 2014, six months later than the original December 2013 reporting date.

ACGME responded with support of "phasing in" the new reporting process in June 2014 and requiring program directors to report semiannually thereafter. This timeline change will be implemented to allow "program directors and faculty members the time to thoughtfully and properly familiarize themselves with reporting milestones data."

This new reporting date will affect general pediatrics (Phase 1) programs only. See the letter [here](#)
