What is the evidence?

- Evaluation of Evidence-Based Practices in Online Learning
 - Purely online learning = face-to-face instruction
 - Blended curriculum versus traditional face-toface curriculum: avg effect size 0.35*

*p<0.001

Face-To-Face	Blended E-Learning
Month long continuous course	20 half-days during outpatient blocks in PGY-1 and PGY-2 year
Small groups: 3-7 residents	Individual learning plus discussion groups of 2-4 residents
Advocacy project over 4 weeks	Advocacy project over a 6 week period on PGY-2 year



- "I've been regularly mentioning the TALK Line to new parents as it's on their checklist, but I thought it was only for medical questions. I'll now encourage families to call them with concerns about ANYTHING or if they're just stressed out."
- "I [now] gather vital information about the patient's ability to adhere to a given plan or their goals for treatment by asking about housing, how they obtain their food, violence/safety where they live."
