Our tips for getting the most out of the meeting

- The Fall Meeting is a relatively small meeting. There are many others who are new to this meeting. Reach out to fellow new members (or seasoned) and exchange contact information (**bring business cards**!). Colleagues from other programs can be excellent peer supports for your new role.
- The **mentoring** session on <u>Wednesday afternoon</u> is designed as a "Meet the Professor" session where you can get free advice from seasoned Program Coordinators. It's informal, sitting around a table, so no pressure and no preparation needed!
- Also on <u>Wednesday afternoon</u> we will be breaking out into two groups:
 Residency and Fellowship Coordinators. The session will tackle common
 challenges we face managing our programs and best practices, followed by
 a session of resources available from the American Academy of Pediatrics
 (AAP).
- The afternoon session on Thursday is Program Coordinator-specific. The session opens with an update from the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS), followed by a presentation on professional development opportunities, and then by an interactive workshop on technology tools!
- APPD is a very down to earth group. Don't be intimidated by anyone. Though some members may be shy, they are all personable and will want to talk to you if you talk to them.
- Don't be afraid to separate from your own tribe. Sit at a table with people you don't know for at least ONE session.
