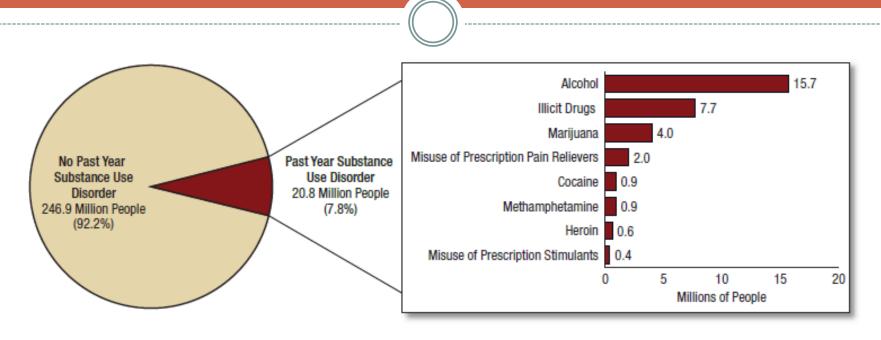

Past Year Substance Use Disorder: 2015

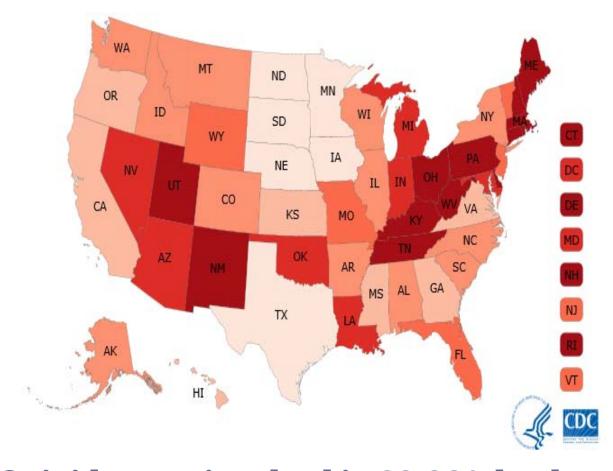


National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 2016





Opiate Deaths, 2015



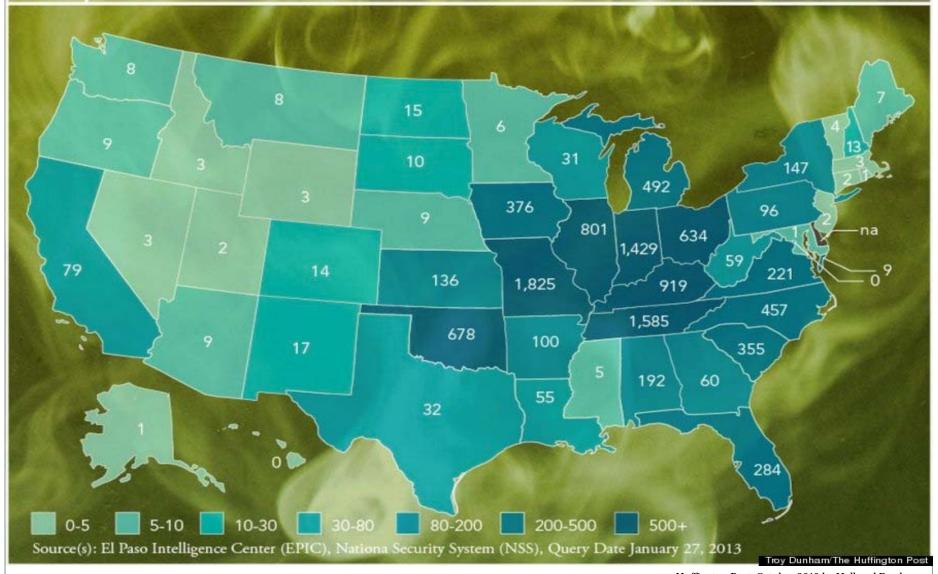
Opioids were involved in 33,091 deaths in 2015, and opioid overdoses have quadrupled since 1999.

Current State of Substance Use Education

- 100% of allopathic medical schools and nearly all osteopathic medical schools require instruction in SUD.
 - Curriculum varies
 - Question of carry over into clinical years
- Required SUD training ranges from 31.8% in pediatrics to 95.0% in psychiatry, with 56.3% for all programs combined.

Recommendations for SUD Education

Table 1. Core Competencies for Managing Substance Use Disorders in Primary Care*

Describe the epidemiology and spectrum of unhealthy substance use, including risky use, problem use, consequences, abuse, and dependence. Screen patients for unhealthy substance use and diagnose substance use disorders.

Assess patients for substance use-related medical, behavioral, and social consequences.

Use brief intervention and other counseling approaches to advise and assist patients concerning unhealthy substance use and substance use disorders. Use medications indicated for the treatment of substance use disorders. Refer patients to substance abuse treatment programs when indicated.

* By the end of training, resident physicians should be able to perform these competencies.

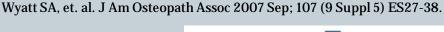

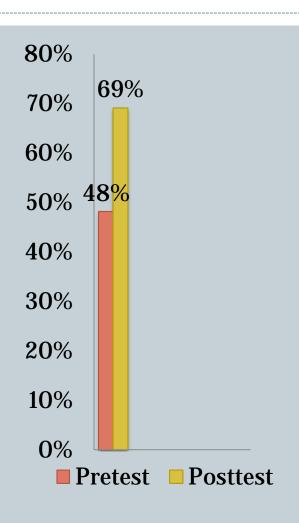
