- Managing inappropriate requests

Chiefs as Teachers and Administrators

- New role of attending and preceptor
- Being expected to "know it all"
- Engaging learners
- Your role at the hospital level

Resident Education

- Chief rounds/chief conferences
- Balancing with other didactic/education sessions
- Changing your conference/didactic sessions/structure
- Evaluations by residents

Professional Development

- Prioritizing your own professional goals
- Finding time for your professional needs (i.e. fellowship application, job interview, etc.)
- Working with your PD and co-chief

Wellness

- Protecting free time
- Balancing with your co-chief
- Maintaining friendships with residents
- Promoting resident wellness, self wellness
