**The Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program**

The Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program is a two-year fellowship designed to allow young physicians committed to clinical medicine to acquire new skills and training in the non-biological sciences important to medical care systems. Approximately 150 pediatricians have participated in the CSP since 1974, representing 19 percent of all former Scholars. 52 percent are in academic medicine, with more than half now at the ranks of Associate Professor and Professor. Another 9 percent are in government positions at the state and national levels.

Annie Lea Shuster, National Program Director, RWJ Clinical Scholars Program, and Marilyn Ferguson, Program Assistant, will attend the APPD meeting to provide information on the Program to interested parties.
