

Adolescent Health Postdoctoral Fellowship at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, Baltimore, Maryland

Position: The Adolescent/Young Adult Health program at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine is recruiting postdoctoral fellows for the 2018-2019 year. The program hosts an interdisciplinary training experience with a focus on clinical care, teaching, research, and advocacy related to reducing health disparities in adolescent and young adult health. Fellows will have the opportunity to be trainees in our **Adolescent Health T32 interdisciplinary training program sponsored by the National Institute on Child Health and Human Development**.

Fellows in this 2-3 year program participate in activities designed to gain expertise in Adolescent Health for a career in academic medicine. Fellows participate in interdisciplinary training activities with other health professionals and have the opportunity to teach and supervise graduate medical trainees. Fellows maintain a patient panel of adolescents and young adults in the Center for Adolescent and Young Adult Health at Harriet Lane. T32 faculty members have appointments across university programs and expertise in general adolescent medicine, addiction medicine, adolescent sexual and reproductive health, HIV medicine, transgender care, advocacy, public health practice, nursing, psychology, nutrition, and social work. Fellows complete research projects under the guidance/mentorship of T32 faculty who are widely published in their fields and participate in a research training curriculum including coursework at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Eligibility: An individual is eligible for the program if he or she has completed residency training in pediatrics, family medicine, internal medicine or internal medicine/pediatrics; is a citizen, noncitizen national or permanent resident alien of the United States; and intends to pursue an academic career as an adolescent health researcher in an area of expertise represented in our program's research mentors.
