

Pediatric Rheumatology Section Chief: University of Oklahoma College of Medicine

The Department of Pediatrics at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Oklahoma City, OK seeks an experienced pediatric rheumatologist to lead our expanding program. We are the only pediatric rheumatology practice in the region and provide state-of-the-art care for children with a broad range of rheumatic diseases. The individual will work collaboratively with members of the Section of Pediatric Rheumatology and provide patient care along with teaching responsibilities. Our ideal candidate will have leadership experience in an academic setting and embrace the opportunity to guide our program. The position is slated for the assistant/associate professor level (non-tenure track) and a well-qualified candidate will be considered for the position of Section Chief.

The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center has 314 inpatient beds and is the only freestanding pediatric hospital in Oklahoma solely dedicated to the treatment of children. The Department of Pediatrics is composed of 15 sections and over 200 faculty members focused on the scholarly delivery of clinical service, the teaching of students and housestaff and the development of applied and basic knowledge through research. We work closely with several research institutions, such as the Children's Hospital Foundation and the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation to support the advancement of research in childhood disease.

OU Medicine has just completed a major transformation and is now an Oklahoma-owned and operated nonprofit. Our new ownership structure fulfills a longtime goal to further advance the state's premier academic health system, elevating patient care, clinical research and the education of health professionals. This is a unique opportunity for a physician to put his/her signature on the pediatric rheumatology program and work closely with the multidisciplinary team to expand services for the children of our region.
