

## **Section Chief of Pediatric Critical Care Medicine: OU College of Medicine**

The Department of Pediatrics at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Oklahoma City, OK is seeking a Section Chief of Pediatric Critical Care Medicine. This is a full-time position offered at the Associate Professor or Professor level. We seek a motivated clinician educator or clinician scientist interested in developing junior faculty and steering the continued growth of a dynamic pediatric intensive care unit in an academic setting. The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center is building a brand new 34 bed PICU with an anticipated opening next spring. Responsibilities include strategic planning, patient care, supervision and teaching of housestaff and medical students, participation in a growing sedation program, and clinical or basic science research. Experience in pediatric cardiac intensive care and interest in the development of clinical trials are desired. Candidates must be Board Certified in Pediatrics and Board Certified/Board Eligible in Pediatric Critical Care, and eligible for licensure in Oklahoma. Rank and salary are commensurate within experience and training.

The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center has 314 inpatient beds and is the only freestanding pediatric hospital in Oklahoma solely dedicated to the treatment of children. The Department of Pediatrics is composed of 15 sections and over 200 faculty members focused on the scholarly delivery of clinical service, the teaching of students and housestaff and the development of applied and basic knowledge through research. We work closely with several research institutions, such as the Children's Hospital Foundation and the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation to support the advancement of research in childhood disease.

OU Medicine has just completed a major transformation and is now an Oklahoma-owned and operated nonprofit. Our new ownership structure fulfills a longtime goal to further advance the state's premier academic health system, elevating patient care, clinical research and the education of health professionals.
