Our residency program, faculty, and administration acknowledge the importance of a diverse community. Our program strives to support and promote an inclusive environment that embraces and celebrates the diversity of our people – residents, faculty members, patients, and communities.

We have established a visiting scholars program for URM medical students who are pursuing a career in pediatrics.

Benefits of the Program:

- One month rotation at Nemours/Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children; the only children's hospital in Delaware
- Experiences tailored to the specific interest of each student
- Inclusion in residency conferences and activities
- Personal meeting with Pediatric Residency Program Directors
- \$2000 stipend for applicants outside the tri-state area (PA, DE, NJ) to cover travel and living expenses
- \$1000 stipend for applicants inside the tri-state area to cover living expenses

Application Requirements:

- Must be in good standing at an LCME-accredited US allopathic/osteopathic medical school
- Member of a group under-represented in medicine  
*(AAMC definition of URM is "Underrepresented in medicine means those racial and ethnic populations that are underrepresented in the medical profession relative to their numbers in the general population.")*
- Must be a fourth year medical student

Application Process:

- Completed fourth year application
- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Board Scores (USMLE, COMLEX or both)
- Personal statement of no more than 1500 words describing your interest/experience in working with diverse communities and anticipated career plans
