The Pediatric Rheumatology fellowship program at UAB was ACGME approved in 2009, two years after the Division of Pediatric Rheumatology was created in 2007. The faculty has grown to 5 board certified pediatric rheumatologists with 4 nurse practitioners, making it one of the largest programs in the southeastern United States. A generous donation/endowment allows us to accept 1 fellow every 3 years, but we are flexible to add more with grant funding from the Rheumatology Research Foundation, the Arthritis Foundation, and support from relevant (Rheumatology, Immunology) campus training grants. We practice and impart a reasoned early and aggressive approach to therapy for children with rheumatic diseases, employing a broad range of biologic therapies. A significant amount of "protected" research time (2 of the 3 years) is granted throughout the training period. Those fellows not working in a basic science laboratory are strongly encouraged to get an advanced degree at UAB in public health, clinical epidemiology, or a related field of interest. At graduation, our fellows are well prepared clinically and academically in all aspects of Pediatric Rheumatology. We are also welcome to training MED-PEDS rheumatology fellows in partnership with our adult rheumatology colleagues at UAB (top 10 nationally, US News & World Report). Program Highlights


The Pediatric Rheumatology fellowship at Children's Hospital at Montefiore (CHAM) and Albert Einstein College of Medicine is a three-year program with the goal of training physicians to become academic leaders in pediatric rheumatology. We are fortunate to serve a racially and economically diverse community in the Bronx/Westchester, providing trainees with exposure to a wide range of rheumatologic diseases, varying medical complexities and an understanding of the psychosocial and economic impact on physical illness.

The Pediatric Rheumatology fellowship training program has been accredited since July 2008. Trainees have been consistently recruited from top institutions across the US, with 100% board pass rate and 100% of fellows securing their top choice in faculty placement upon graduation.

Program Highlights:

- Our team: 4 board certified pediatric rheumatology faculty with expertise in JDM, SLE, Scleroderma, JIA, mental health, healthcare disparities and medical education; 4 fellows (including 1 Med/Peds position); 1 staff nurse; 1 research coordinator; administrative staff and social work support
- <u>Clinical:</u> Broad exposure to all aspects of pediatric rheumatic disease with a wide range of clinical presentations. Close interdisciplinary clinical involvement with adult rheumatology, dermatology, nephrology, immunology and ophthalmology.
- Education: Weekly didactic sessions with case based modules. Dedicated specialized curriculum for immunology, research methodology, quality improvement and MSK ultrasound. Educational opportunities exist for formal training in research methodology (MS, MPH).
- Research: Scholarly opportunities available in collaboration with other disciplines within the institution, nationally and internationally. Extensive involvement with research consortiums such as the Childhood Arthritis and Rheumatology Research Alliance (CARRA) and patient-focused foundations.


