# Fall Meeting Highlights

There were over 60 registrants with great engagement and discussion throughout the sessions. The fellowship grassroots session featured an update on the EPA to Milestone 2.0 mapping project for subspecialties along with practical application strategies. # ABP Subspecialty In-Training Exam (SITE) Update

Due to overwhelmingly positive feedback and the successful pilot implementation of Internet-Based Testing (IBT) for the 2023 SITE across 16 institutions and four pediatric subspecialty areas, ABP has decided to transition to administering the SITE online at our own institutions. Please instruct your fellows to register online on the ABP portal. Once one of your fellows signs up, you will have ability to designate proctors for the exam. The exam registration period is November 1, 2023 – January 11, 2024, and exam administration is February 7 – 21, 2024. Please refer to the ABP portal for additional information.

# EPA to Milestones 2.0 Mapping Project

Representatives from each pediatric subspecialities worked in teams to map EPA levels of supervision to milestones 2.0 levels. The ABP is in the process of creating an automated program which will give provide corresponding milestone scores for each EPA level. This tool is projected to be available by the end of the year.

# NASEM Report

National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) recently released the 2023 <u>report</u> on "The Future Pediatric Subspecialty Physician Workforce: Meeting the Needs of Infants, Children, and Adolescents". This in-depth report outlines recommendations that aim to improve the quality of pediatric medical subspecialty care through a well-supported, superbly trained, and appropriately used primary care, subspecialty, and physician-scientist workforce. It includes topics such as pediatric health care needs and access to care, pediatric subspecialty training and workforce trends, and the financing of children's health care.
