 - Coursework: Fellows have the opportunity to enroll in either the <u>Master of Public Health</u> (MPH) or <u>Master of Science in</u> <u>Clinical Investigation</u> (MSCI) program at Vanderbilt
 - Research:
 - Fellows are expected to design and implement a clinical research project that will result in manuscript(s) for presentation at a national meeting and submission to an academic journal
 - Research mentors will be determined based on topic of interest
 - Teaching: Fellows participate in and present at Department and Division conferences
