

Program Culture

The Endocrine Division has 16 physicians, 3 fellows, 8 nurse practitioners, along with more than 20 endocrine nurses, diabetes educators, dieticians and social workers. We have 19,000 ambulatory patient encounters yearly including caring for over 2000 children with diabetes. In addition to delivering excellent patient care, we are proud of our efforts to improve care through our NIH-supported clinical research program.

Institution Culture

UT Southwestern is an academic medical center, world renowned for its research, regarded among the best in the country for medical education and for clinical and scientific training, and nationally recognized for the quality of clinical care. The Medical Center has four degree-granting institutions: UT Southwestern Medical School, UT Southwestern Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, UT Southwestern School of Health Professions, and UT Southwestern School of Public Health.

- The schools train nearly 3,700 medical, graduate, and health profession students, residents, and postdoctoral fellows each year.
