# Academic General Pediatrics (AGP) Fellowship at Cohen Children's Medical Center in NY

- Prepare trainees to improve pediatric health care in population health, health equity, and health services.
- Offer additional interdisciplinary, community-engaged research training to address key clinical, health services, and policy issues in primary care pediatrics and health services.

## Research

- **Strengths:** vaccine hesitancy, breastfeeding promotion, health inequities with social determinants of health, working with underserved populations, obesity medicine and care of children with chronic medical conditions.
- Access to scholastic and research resources of the Feinstein Institute for Medical Research, Institute of Health System Science, Occupational Medicine, Epidemiology and Prevention.

## Education

- **Postgraduate training:** health policy, health economics, epidemiology, biostatistics, and other methodologic disciplines in primary care research, including health disparities, multilingual and qualitative research methods.
- Apply knowledge from Hofstra's Master in Public Health or Master of Science in Education to develop, implement and evaluate new curricula
- Tracks available in obesity medicine, research, and medical education

## Clinical Experience

- **Practice:** located in Queens, NY, arguably most diverse county in the nation, providing unparalleled experience in cultural diversity.
- The Division of General Pediatrics sees over 60,000 children annually and is the ambulatory training site for nearly 100 pediatric residents, over 120 medical students, and several allied health professionals.
