Summary of main findings (1-3 paragraphs)

PD respondents have been in their role an average of 5.5 years, with a range of 0-26 years.
The majority are associate professors and mean program size 43 residents (range 4-143).
Mean time for PD role 57% (range 35-100%)
51% say they have sufficient time to do their role.
64% of PDs are either general pediatricians or pediatric hospitalists.
51% report to the department chair, 24% to the DIO, and 18% to the Vice Chair of education.
76% of PDs are paid based on their specialty rank and experience, while 24% are based on department-wide or GME-wide salary, or un known.
35% have a salary supplement for being PD which amounts to 5K to >25K.
20% are likely to resign in the next year, with reasons cited: change in resident work ethic, 18% difficulty balancing work and family, 16% too many admin responsibilities, and 16% insufficient departmental support.
The majority of PDs report no or some stress, while 31% report burnout.
95% are satisfied with their relationship with residents.
