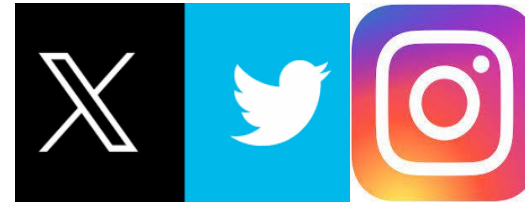

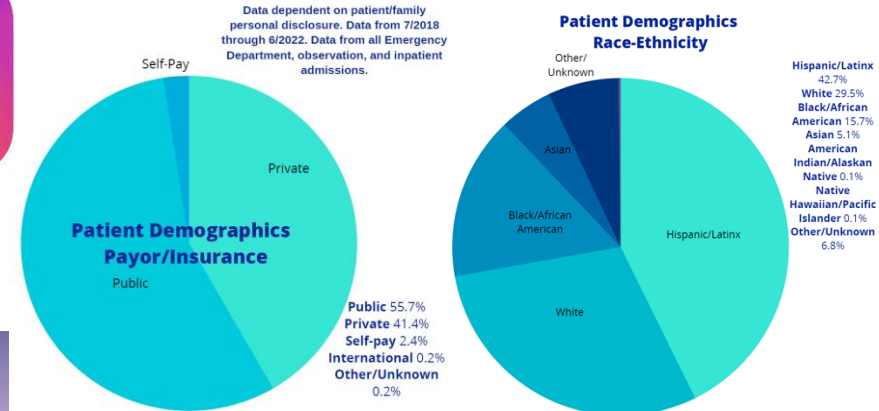

Program Highlights

- The Pediatric Intensive Care Unit has a 50-bed capacity. 26 beds are a closed PICU unit, 24 beds are flexible for PICU, general surgery, and hospital medicine.
- The PICU is a mixed medical-surgical, neonatal, pediatric and adolescent unit with emphasis on cardiopulmonary, neurological and surgical problems; including, respiratory distress, pneumonia, croup, apnea, asthma, near drowning, acute renal failure, child abuse, complex and refractory seizure disorders, meningitis, Guillain-Barre Syndrome, ingestions, diabetes, neurosurgery, trauma, facial reconstructions and scoliosis.
- Clinical services are housed at Children's of Alabama Hospital, a 750,000 square foot facility on the UAB health system's downtown Birmingham campus.
- Children's of Alabama is the only freestanding children's hospital and the only ECMO, transplant, burn, and level 1 trauma center in the state.

Fellowship

The UAB Pediatric Critical Care Fellowship is a fully accredited three-year program that combines research and clinical experiences to prepare our trainees to become excellent intensivists who are ready to become successful in the academic setting. There are 13 four-week blocks annually, for 39-months which includes 21 clinical months, 18 months research, and 12 weeks of vacation (4 weeks annually). All fellows are credentialed in Deep Sedation in the first six months of training.

Clinical Services are housed in the Children's of Alabama Hospital, a 750,000 square foot, facility on the UAB health system's downtown Birmingham campus.

PICU Fellows rotate through the PICU Unit as well as the CVICU Unit

- 12 months spent in PICU, 4 months spent in CVICU
- 50-bed multispecialty, combined medical surgical unit
- Approximately 2,000 PICU admissions per year
- >200 annual cases of congenital heart disease that require cardiopulmonary bypass
- Trainees are exposed to the care of neonates and infants with very complex heart defects including extracorporeal membrane oxygenation and mechanical assist devices
- Opportunities for basic science, simulation, translational, social determinants of health, Global Health, and quality improvement-based research among others

Other Elective Rotations: Critical Care Transport, Burn, Adult Critical Care, Anesthesia, Pulmonary, Palliative Care, Cardiology/Cath lab services.
